Beginner class

Introduction to chess pieces, setup, basic rules including checking, castling and material value will be covered.

Intermediate class

Students learn the higher concepts of chess notation, "en passant", forks, pins, and swarming along with tactics and strategies. This course is for players who have already mastered the beginner level core concepts.

Advanced class

Learn refined chess tactics & strategies to make you a chess winner! Topics covered include principles of openings, mid-game strategies, and how to play the endgame. Registrants must have taken the intermediate course or have commensurate chess

Please use the following definitions as guidelines to assess your child's skill level. Students in primary grades typically repeat the Beginner curriculum to build their confidence and skills before moving to the Intermediate level.

- 1. Beginning Class Student has not played chess before or is still learning the fundamentals (as listed under "Beginning")
- 2. Intermediate Class To get the most out of this course, students must already have a clear understanding of these concepts taught in the Beginning Class:

 How pieces move and capture

 Check and checkmate

 Castling

 Pawn promotion

 Concept of material
- 3. Advanced Class -To be successful in this class, registrants must have a working knowledge of these concepts taught in the intermediate class: Chess notation En Passant Forks Pins Attacking the "f" pawn

Classes progress through lessons as students learn each topic. Beginner students receive a travel size <u>magnetic chess set</u>. Beginner and Intermediate students receive a <u>resource comic book</u>. Students in all courses receive weekly <u>worksheets</u>.

Beginning Chess Course

Welcome to the World of Chess! Beginning Lesson 1—Meet the chess pieces, how they move, learn how to set up the board and the basic rules of play. Discover a special move called pawn promotion.

Where's the check? Beginning Lesson 2—You win the game when your opponent cannot move his/her King to safety. Learn the difference between check and checkmate.

Two Moves in One! Beginning Lesson 3—Protect your King by moving him to a safe place in one of his "castles." It is a weird move called castling

Making Che\$\$ Money! Beginning Lesson 4—Become skilled at making good trades. This is called knowing material

Working Together! Beginning Lesson 5—Use your pieces together to become a winning team against your foe's King.

King of the Best Fortress! *Beginning Lesson 6*—The theme of this lesson is basic strategy and controlling the center of the board.

Train Your Chess Eyes! Beginning Lesson 7—Your eyes and brain combine to find the right moves! Meet your mentor: "CHAD"

Meet a Master: Paul Morphy! Beginning Lesson 8—The past reveals one of the greatest natural chess geniuses in history.

Intermediate Chess Course

Just Checking *Intermediate Lesson 1*—Assesses the student's knowledge of beginning course content.

The Chess Language Intermediate Lesson 2—Students will be taught how to record chess moves or notation.

The Weakest Link *Intermediate Lesson 3*—Discover a great tactic: attacking the "f" pawn.

En Passant – The Weird Pawn Move Intermediate Lesson 4— En Passant is a very difficult concept in chess – it does not fit with the other moves in the game.

Forks: The Multi-attack Tactic! - Intermediate Lesson 5—Forks are a devastating basic tactic in intermediate chess play.

Pins: Sticking to it! *Intermediate Lesson* 6—The ability to pin piece one to another makes long range pieces so dangerous.

Swarming Your Opponent : *Intermediate Lesson 7*—Students will be taught the importance of counting attackers and defenders.

Meet a Master: Jose Capablanca Intermediate Lesson 8 - Cuban born, Capablanca never read a chess book vet became a champion.

Advanced Chess Course

Let the Games Begin! Advanced Lesson 1—The first move of a game often determines who wins. Learn some great openings. The Great Escape! Advanced Lesson 2—Types of draws and stalemate.

The King and I! Advanced Lesson 3—Win with only a King and a Pawn.

Endgame Secrets! Advanced Lesson 4—Most common endgame positions will be covered.

Chess Eureka! Advanced Lesson 5— Discovered attacks and double attacks.

Keystone Defenders! *Advanced Lesson* 6—Your opponent's structure crumbles when you take out the key defenders.

Midgame Attacks! Advanced Lesson 7— Use: Hanging Pieces, Exposed King, and Overworked Pieces to win.
